

### **About John Muir**

"When we contemplate the whole globe as one great dewdrop, striped and dotted with continents and islands, flying through space with all other stars all singing and shining together as one, the whole universe appears as an infinite storm of beauty." – John Muir

John Muir (1838–1914) was America's most famous and influential naturalist and conservationist. Born in Scotland, John Muir immigrated to the United States with his family when he was eleven years old. After growing up in Wisconsin, spending time in Canada and journeying on a thousand–mile walk to the Gulf of Mexico, he found his way to the high country of the Sierra Nevada, eventually making California his home.

As a wilderness explorer, he is renowned for his exciting adventures in California's Sierra Nevada, among Alaska's glaciers, and around the world in search of natural beauty.

As a writer, he taught the people of his time and ours the importance of experiencing and protecting our natural heritage. His writings contributed greatly to the creation of Yosemite, Sequoia, Mount Rainier, Petrified Forest, and Grand Canyon National Parks. His home in Martinez, California is now a National Historic Site. www.nps.gov/jomu/
